




MARCH 6TH: WILDERNESS FISHERIES MANAGEMENT



Speakers: Jim Vashro; retired FWP fisheries manager, **Leo Rosenthal**; FWP fisheries biologist, **Matt Boyer**; FWP science program supervisor
Montana FWP fisheries managers will describe efforts to preserve fisheries integrity in the BMW. Fish population estimates and creel surveys were first used to establish fishing regulations in the early 80s. Subsequent census and bull trout management efforts will be discussed. Finally, the efforts to remove non-native rainbows and Yellowstone Cutthroat Trout to preserve the integrity of the South Fork will be discussed.
